

- Dam Management
- > Focused on Needs and Recommendations
- Implementation Table

Need: Ensure that bridges and culverts are adequately sized.

Develop an in-lieu fee mitigation option (DES) for projects that impact floodplains and stream channels.



HB 648 Flood Commission Implementation Need: Ensure that bridges and culverts are adequately sized.

- Adopt wetland rules that incorporate the following design guidance:
 - To allow for passage of the 100-year frequency storm.
 - To ensure to the maximum extent possible that there is no increase in flood stages on abutting properties.
 - Flow and sediment transport characteristics will not be affected in a manner which could adversely affect channel stability as described in the NH Fish and Game Stream Crossing Guidance (September 2008)

Need: Establish a state-level regulatory approach for floodplain management.

Incorporate floodplain management into existing state regulatory programs; specifically DES Alteration of Terrain (AoT) and Wetlands Bureau.




Need: Establish a state-level fluvial erosion hazard program

- Provide a state funding mechanism to support staffing for the program
- Amend state law, if necessary, to allow for the establishment of fluvial erosion hazard ordinances



Need: Increased information collection to improve flood forecasting.

Improve GIS and LiDAR data for state to help identify potential flood inundation areas
